Dear Dean Swarthout:

Thanks for your fine letter in regard to the use of Hoch Auditorium. I should be glad to talk to you about the whole situation some time.

We appreciate the time allotted to us in your schedule for the next three weeks, but we would very much liked to have used the auditorium next Monday afternoon, just prior to our Nebraska game. This is a situation similar to the occasion last year just prior to the Missouri game when we were very desirous of using the court for practice.

The 4:30 hour is practically out of the question for us, as we dislike to expose the boys to the cold air after they have been exercising here in the gymnasium. As I told you, we like to start about 2:30 or 3 o'clock, giving them first the inactive fundamentals like free throws, then gradually working up to the more strenuous activities. After they have begun to perspire it is dangerous to send them out to another building.
