Dear Don:

I was glad to hear that you are planning to attend K.U. next fall. I hope that the old ticker is fine and that you need not worry on that score.

Coach George Sauer and his assistants have a very fine looking squad of football prospects for this fall. The backfield is particularly well manned with about twenty good backs. I would suggest that you plan to concentrate on becoming a line-man this fall.

The rooming situation is very difficult. There are to be some rooms available near the campus in some emergency housing, but rooms in private homes are practically non-existing.
