

FEEES PAID FOR OFFICIATING (Continued)

11. One institution selects officials from athletes who are receiving some assistance.
12. One institution pays intramural basket ball and softball officials by requiring competing teams to contribute \$1.00 for each game. Another institution requires each competing team to pay officials 75¢ per game.
13. One institution pays officials for football and baseball \$1.00 per game, basketball 75¢ per game and volley ball 40¢ per hour.
14. There is quite general evidence that most institutions that pay officials have a definite scale depending upon the sport involved. One institution pays \$5.00 per official per game for football and \$2.50 for other sports.

ENTRY FEES

1. Number of schools at which competing organizations are not required to pay an entry fee - - - - - 60
2. Number of schools requiring an entry fee for competing teams - - - - 22
3. Number of schools designating that entry fee is in reality a "guarantee to play fee" which is returnable if schedule is played. - - - - - 3
4. Institutions using entry fees --
 - (a.) exclusively for purchasing trophies - - - - - 8
 - (b.) for awards and general administration- - - - - 1
 - (c.) for equipment - - - - - 2
 - (d.) for equipment and general administration - - - - - 1
 - (e.) for awards and equipment - - - - - 2
 - (f.) for general administration- - - - - 2
 - (g.) to pay officials - - - - - 1
