The furlough action came as somewhat of a shock, but was honestly as stated, no fault of personal application but a case of circumstance. I feel sure that I will be able to find placement soon, possibly in some other Federal Bureau. I have had no success to date in contacting various aeronautics concerns - private and governmental - but have promising prospects pending.

My family is very well. We have a girl starting to school this fall. The other girl is just three. My parents are also doing nicely, and visit us occasionally in Elk City. This country here isn't so nice, and if I can find nearly as good a job elsewhere I will Beel that we have made an improvement.

As always, my very kindest regards to Mrs. Allen. We continue to hope to be able to visit Lawrence, and will do so before much longer.
