



Dear Harry:

Bob Busby carried a story regarding a statement alleged to you that I stated I was going after the gold next year. Of course, short press dispatches are always inadequate to portray any real portent and meaning and many people misunderstand.

Bill Money Penny spoke to me last Saturday morning in Lawrence regarding a game with Southwestern. I told Bill that they had perhaps cut down on our schedule from 20 to 18 games, and if that was the case I would naturally want to play the games that would net the athletic association a good return. Understand that neither the coach nor the team derive any benefit from a good guarantee. However, since each coach is anxious that his sport show black figures instead of red, they naturally would desire a game that would pay a good gate. It is the same proposition as a sport writer writing sports for a paper that would decidedly pay more for his services than the other paper. This would lead us to believe that our work is the better appreciated.

We are not barnstorming or looking for pots of gold, but naturally we will play Oklahoma Aggies at each place, and we have two games with the University of Texas to be played in Lawrence. We may go East, and since it costs a good deal to travel we would naturally want a gate large enough to pay expenses. Our Oklahoma Aggie game at Stillwater paid us a thousand dollars at the gate. Since our conference guarantee for all games is \$400, you can readily appreciate that there are many places where guarantees of \$400 to \$600 with an option are not uncommon.

However, I desire to state to you that it has not been our policy to play for gate receipts along, because for years we have played teams like Southwestern, both home and home, Baker University, Kansas Wesleyan, Ottawa, Washburn, and Emporia Teachers. Through connections of Tad Reid, a former Kansas man, we played



Warrensburg Teachers both at Lawrence and at Warrensburg. We also played Doane College of Crete, Nebraska, because the coach desired to make a trip to Manhattan where his brother was coaching track.

I believe this attitude on the part of Kansas shows that we are not looking for the money alone, but since it takes money to make the mare or an athletic team go, I am sure you will agree with me that we desire to strike a happy medium and yet pay our share and keep everybody happy, if possible. We also entered the Washburn Sunflower Tournament last Christmas. This was an evident gesture on the part of Kansas to enter a tournament where the colleges and not the universities were entered.

I am expecting to be in Winfield soon, as I speak at Wichita Rotary on Monday noon, so I will drop in and say hello to you.

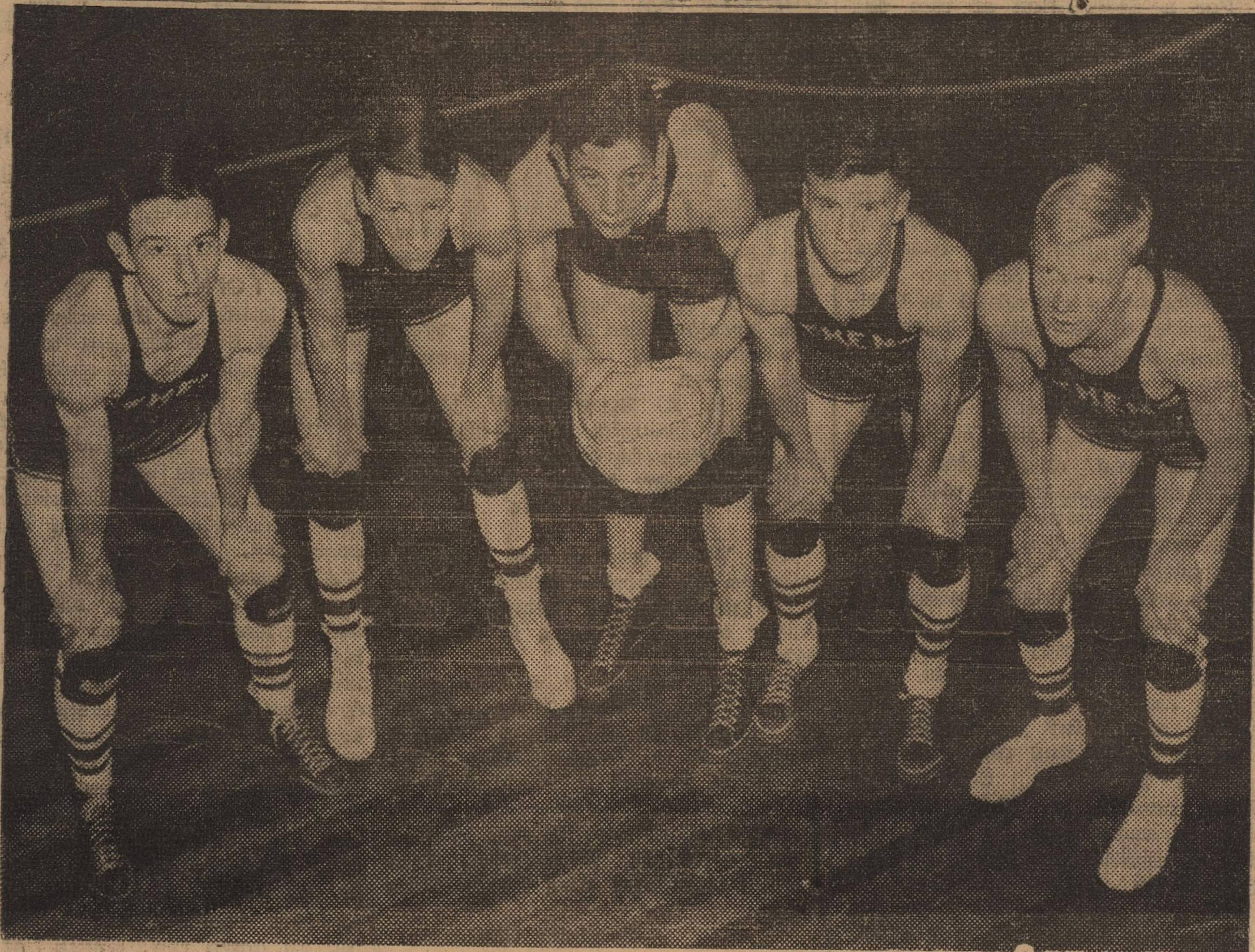
