Dear William:

In last night's Kansas City Star, Friday, April 20, 1945, Mr. C. E. McBride did a splendid job in recounting the incidents of your beloved father before he met his untimely death. I know you will agree with me that Mr. McBride handled this situation in a most exceptional manner.

The article out of Lawrence, Kansas, at the time of the Kansas-Nebraska game last fall came from a student correspondent here in Lawrence, not a sports writer from Mr. McBride's desk. There are so many reporters that write feature articles on these subjects that errors may creep into some of their work.

Dr. Kennedy stated to me that the correspondent with whom he talked used the telephone and did not contact Dr. Kennedy in person. Therefore, some of these discrepancies might be charged to faulty phone audition. I believe that must have been the cause. When I talked to Dr. Kennedy he was very happy to have this corrected and said for me to tell Mr. McBride that he would consider it a favor if Mr. McBride would issue any correction consistent with the information that I passed on to him.

I am enclosing a copy of Mr. McBride's "Sporting Comment", in which he describes your dad. If you want additional copies I would suggest that you write the Kansas City Star and they will send them to you.
