Five Years -- College of Emporia: Played 40 games, lost 3.

Nine Years -- University of Missouri: Played 75 games, lost 26.  
First 7 years, played 58 games, lost 15.

Nine Years -- Big Six Teams: Played 44 games, lost 15.  
First 7 years, played 38 games, lost 9.

Missouri won three championships and finished second, three times. At the end of seven years, Missouri was well ahead of all Big Six teams. At nine years, two schools, Nebraska and Kansas, were even in games won and lost.

In the nine years we played 32 non-conference games, lost 10. The first seven years we played 25 games, lost 5.

Our non-conference games have been with the strongest teams in the country, having played such teams as Chicago, Northwestern, West Virginia, Tulane, Southern Methodist, Texas, New York, Southern California and others. We defeated Chicago, Northwestern under Hanley, West Virginia, twice when they were Eastern champions, tied Tulane twice and lost from Southern California after no score the first half, 20 to 7, lost to New York, tied Southern Methodist at Columbia, and lost to them at Dallas. We had one bad year, 1931.

I am especially proud of Missouri's record with Nebraska. Before I came to Missouri, she had managed to score once in 26 years on Nebraska. We defeated Nebraska three years in a row and when they had one of their greatest teams, defeating the Notre Dame Great Four Horsemen, and Illinois when they had Grange. We defeated them in 1925, 1926 and 1927.

St. Louis Professional Teams -- 1933: Played 16 games, lost 2.  
Lost to Cincinnati, 7 to 0.  
Won from Brooklyn 21 to 7.  
Lost to Green Bay 21 to 0.  
Won from Chicago Cardinals 26 to 6.  
Tied the National Champions, Chicago Bears, 0 to 0.

New Mexico University -- 1934, 1935:  
Won the Border Conference championship -- 1934.  
Played 9 games, lost 1 to Arizona University 13 to 6, 1934.  
Lost two games in the conference, 1935.
