Dear Mr. Chisholm:

I acknowledge receipt of your favor of the 13th inst. and in reply beg to state that I still have the jacket and pants for the warm-up garment that Lowe & Campbell made for me back in 1926.

It was my original scheme to protect the shoulders, head and neck of the basket ball players when they get warm and when they are cooling off to keep them from catching cold. My argument has always been that if you protect the arm, neck and shoulders of a baseball player when he gets up a sweat why would it not be perfectly logical and proper that you protect the neck and shoulders of a basket ball player, because just as much depends on a player being in tip top shape in basket ball as it does in baseball regarding the pitcher.

Years ago I had a hood with a zipper attachment which was separate from the jacket. Then after talking with Lowe & Campbell they said they could attach it to the jacket with a zipper effect. So this came out of research after long experimental work with this type of equipment.
