Dear George:

I acknowledge receipt of your favor of the 8th instant regarding the use of the gymnasium for commercial exhibits by the committee in charge of the Teachers Convention, for which you were very welcome.

I must confess that I think we lose a great deal by our failure to carry on our work in the gymnasium at that time. With all the superintendents, principals and teachers in town for such an occasion I feel that of all groups on the campus certainly the Physical Education majors should be on parade at that time.

I see no reason why it would not be possible to use a portion of the Union Building for such an exhibit. With ample facilities for checking equipment and handling large crowds, such as Homecoming, it appears to me that this work could be handled over there.

We have 84 Physical Education majors, and some time I hope to tell you our aims for the future in this department. Our Physical Education majors are to have distinctive uniforms which will set them out from the average student. This, of course, applies to their formal gymnasium and physical education work.

I am hoping in the next two years that plans can be made so that our department will be able to function as this most propitious time, and that we can carry on our work in such a way that it will get the favorable attention of all concerned.
