HELP OPEN MORE NURSERIES

After six weeks of study and consultation with British leaders, Governor Allen brings back word that the most effective thing America can do at this time in child aid is to open more nurseries in the country. Not less than 100 homes in England and Scotland, for children under five, evacuated from districts threatened by bombing, are urgently needed.
