I am enclosing the diagram of the shooting lanes where bank shots are to be used. In the area outside of these lanes you would shoot directly for the basket. If there is any further question you desire to ask, please write me.

The diagram of the backboard for shooting practice is based on the four by six backboard. You can use these measurements to diagram your lima bean backboard by projecting these lines out away from the basket. The air paths for a high arch shot, I believe, are plainly enough illustrated to teach the boy to shoot high enough so that he will over-shoot or bank the ball and if any fall short they will go into the basket.






