I have just talked with Dr. E. R. Elbel, Associate Professor of Physical Education of the University of Kansas, about my qualifications for the physical education work which is available in your department.

I will have at the end of this semester thirty hours of Physical Education and by the end of the year, I will have my master's degree in Education and Physical Education. I have also four years experience as director of athletics and physical education in public schools. I am now employed as Assistant in the Department of Physical Education at the University of Kansas, and as Director of all intramural sports, physical education instructor and coach at the Lawrence Junior High School.
