Dear Mr. Johnston:

Thank you for your special delivery letter as of March 7th. I note from your letter that you have sold the Vocational Department on a four-weeks course for the sum of \$100.00 with the understanding with them that if you could not get all the training in four weeks they would extend the time required.

That is entirely agreeable with me. I also note that they are accustomed to having students take four months to one year to secure the training for \$100.00. That would be entirely agreeable with me to have you spend that time here, if it is possible. Of course it would not be such an intensive course and it would be an hour or two a day, while this other is individual instruction which, of course, naturally comes higher on account of taking the individual's time.

I am very glad you wrote me, and will expect the contract and will sign it and send it back to them as soon as possible.

If it would be possible for you to come up here and spend the entire nine months I would have been very glad to give you the instruction, but your garden and your home in Oklahoma City prevent that, of course.
