Your letter enclosing check for \$4.48 has been turned over to Mr. Earl Falkenstien, financial secretary of the Athletic Association; who is in charge of all ticket sales. I have but two tickets - one for Mrs. Allen and one for me. That is the total number that I have purchased this fall.

Doubtless you have read that the tickets have been on sale since September and the sale is now around the goal line. I am sorry that I cannot be of service to you in this regard. Mr. Falkenstien will follow your directions regarding the holding of the tickets until Thanksgiving morning, and if you do not want them it would be advisable to wire Mr. Falkenstien early so that he could release them.

I would discuss with Billy Hutson the ticket sale if I did not know that everybody in Lawrence is endeavoring to buy tickets from some of their friends outside, and there are absolutely no tickets being held back, either by friends here in Lawrence or by members of the athletic staff.

You can appreciate the tremendous interest in this game and consequently the pressure to get tickets that should have been bought months ago.

I have just now called Estes, Payne and Company and asked them to write you regarding their quotation for stadium bonds. I think they are selling around par.
