Dear Mr. McInerney:

Acknowledging your inquiry of the 10th instant, beg to state that we have a very large class this semester in First Aid. We have 70 enrolled in our First Aid class. However, we will not have nearly as many again, as previously this was a state requirement, and First Aid has now been removed from state requirements for a teachers certificate.

The First Aid course is offered but one semester each year. The course gives 2 hours credit in the School of Education.

We are using the American Red Cross First Aid Textbook, Revised, and we are insisting that every member of the class possess a copy. The paper back books sell for 60¢ and the clothbound books sell for \$1.00.

Personally, I would question the advisability of a manuscript for First Aid, especially since the First Aid Textbook is so complete and thorough. In addition, it is very inexpensive and I doubt that any publishers can compete with this publication.
