Dees showed me one the other day and I, of course, told him to refer it to Mr. Falkenstien, who would write a letter about it, but on second thought I felt that I should also call your attention to it to see what the difficulty is, if you can tell me.

We deflate the balls every afternoon after practice and they are not blown up again until 2:30 in the afternoon. So the air is only in them from about 2:30 to 6.

Last year we had this same difficulty, and we have just started this year. These are a new shipment that came this fall. I would be happy for you to tell me what you know about it.
