Mr. Cummings is a brakeman on the railway, but he suffered a compound fracture of his right leg in an automobile accident some year and a half ago. The doctor who put the leg in a cast failed to tape the arch properly and he has a very stiff foot.

I examined the foot very carefully and find there is some movement between the bones of the foot, but it is a bad case.
