Dear Mr. Truby:

Thank you for your kind letter of March 4th. I greatly appreciate your good wishes. The game at Norman this coming Friday night will be a tough one, but we are going to do our best. It will be the sixth game in seventeen days for our team.

The game Friday night will determine whether or not there will be a three-way tie for the Big Six championship. If Oklahoma wins, and there is a three-way tie, that will mean that Missouri, Oklahoma and Kansas will have to schedule play-offs early the following week to determine the representative to play in the N.C.A.A. basketball tournament to be held in Kansas City on March 22 and 23.

I am telling you these things because there is a possibility that I might be unable to be with you on Tuesday evening, the 12th. We would hold this conference play-off on March 11 and 12.

I trust that it will not be necessary for me to miss your basketball banquet on the 12th. However, I shall advise you just as soon as possible.
