I have checked with Mr. Falkenstein and the price is 40¢ for tickets Monday night. When tickets are sold under this plan there is, of course, no reduction, but if you would want to handle tickets at Baker, Mr. Falkenstien would make the price 25¢. This arrangement we had with Ottawa.
