Dear Mr. Brown:

This will acknowledge receipt of your inquiry of the 19th instant concerning our new game of "Goal-Hi". I am glad to know of your interest, and as soon as we get out a printed book of rules I shall be glad to let you know.

We started this game as one of our summer playground activities here on the campus, and the newspapers took it up as something new and interesting. We are hoping that the game will find favor as both a winter and summer sport, inasmuch as the goal may be used either in a gymnasium or on an outdoor playground. The height of the goal is adjustable, so that the game may be played by elementary, high school, or college men and women equally well.

We have been using regular basketball rules for the game, using a circular court with a radius of 30 feet, for adults, with the goal 10 feet high. When a foul is called the free throw is tossed from a 15 foot radius line. We have also played the game using a penalty box, similar to the penalty box in hockey. Under this system, when a player commits a foul he is sent to the penalty box for one minute, at the expiration of which time he resumes his place in the game without interruption.

We are working on rules to be printed, and as soon as we have something available I shall be glad to write you again. In the meantime, if you have any further questions it will be a pleasure to hear from you.
