Dear Maurice:

I am sending you a carbon copy of my letter as of July 6, 1938. There was a committee appointed by the Athletic Board, of which Dean Stockton was chairman. Dean Stockton in a letter on June 2, 1938, asked if the head of the departments interested in building for physical education or athletics to submit their findings to him so that he could correlate them all, and with his committee make recommendations to the Athletic Board.

We asked that the more important suggestions be put first. You can see by this letter and by all statements that I made that a new women's building incorporating gymnasium and recreational facilities is the outstanding need of the Department of Physical Education.

I trust that the length of this letter will not fatigue you. But it does dovetail into all of our statements made early and late.
