Dear Mr. Allen:

I have talked with Dean Smith, Mr. Shenk, and Mr. Elbell in regards to equitation courses offered for credit. They agree with me that it might be well to simplify as well as complete the courses offered.

My plan is to offer two semesters of equitation for credit: one elementary; and one advanced. This would round out the course for the students and do away with the quarter semester riders.

By combining the courses, I could fill the classes, increase the number of riders, and take less of Mr. Shenk's time. It is quite important that I build up the classes at present, as increased expenses of operation and addition of horses last fall makes it necessary. I have lost several students due to the war, and I should like to have most of my first semester riders continue through second semester.
