Dear Mr. Miller:

I am happy to reply to your inquiry of recent date concerning our play-off in 1940.

In that year we held a tri-championship in the Big Six Conference with Missouri and Oklahoma. We held a play-off to determine the Big Six representative, and Kansas won this right. The Oklahoma Aggies were the Missouri Valley champions, so a play-off was held in Wichita between Kansas and Oklahoma A. & M. to determine the representative of the Fifth District in the N.C.A.A.

Kansas won this play-off, and we entered the N.C.A.A. tournament in Kansas City, and were the winners of the Western Finals. We were defeated in the final game by Indiana, the winner of the N.C.A.A. championship.

Since this time, however, the Big Six has rules that there are to be no play-offs to determine which school has the right to represent the Big Six Conference. This right is determined by the offensive-defensive ratio of the teams.

I trust this gives you the desired information. If I can be of further service to you I shall be happy to hear from you.
