Dear Dr. Allen:

Greetings to you! I presume that I will see you at the convention in New York but I thought that I might make a tentative arrangement with you for next year prior to the convention. I have the following dates in mind for our program in Chicago; starting Saturday, December 20th, we will play every Saturday *then* night up to and including the 14th day of February, 1942, with a lapse of one week. Starting February 23rd or thereabouts we intend to conduct an East-West basketball tournament scheduled so as not to interfere with NCAA or any other collegiate tournament. The object will be to pick two teams to represent the West against two teams to represent the East, in what we hope will become an annual affair in Chicago.

I know I can count on your cooperation but I really want more than that, I want your advice. I have not asked anyone but you for advice because in my opinion you're the one man who is best qualified to render suggestions regarding the advancement and progress of our great game.
