I am not very hot on the officiating of Mr. Lance. I like him as a fellow, but his calling of foot faults is more of a high school interpretation, and he seems to be very indecisive. Each time he has been here at Lawrence the crowd appreciates him less.

I saw the Iowa State-Missouri game - we got there after the game started and left before the finish, so we did not get a chance to see you - but I noticed the crowd wasn't very fond of him down there. But is it right to rise up and say that Missouri is not fond of any official? That is meant to be a joke, and not serious criticism.
