Dear Mr. McGraw:

I have just a few outstanding bills that I have not cleared up on "Better Basketball".

When Mr. ^{Clain} McLean was here the second time he took certain pictures that did not pan out properly, so it was necessary to get Mr. Voght, a local photographer here, to do some of it. These pictures were included in the correction sent you along with Mr. McLean's pictures.

Those that I recall were an athlete lying on the table and the operator using pressure on the back of the athlete to reduce pain after a kick in the abdomen.

Also, when you desired photographs of the author I got some pictures from Photographer Moore, down town, to send you.

This bill was \$6.50. When I spoke to you in New York I failed to mention these items to you.

Also, when the first diagrams were made for the book I found that when I drew them I did not get them according to scale. We had some difficulty, so I engaged Professor Ed Elbel, a draftsman here at the University, who did all drawings of the diagrams to scale. I sketched them off on a piece of paper and he drew them in conformity with the scale and the basketball court. There were 80 odd of those and after he drew them and then corrected them with my supervision upon the return from Mr. Hyland, he presented a bill for \$50.00.
