Dr. Allen gave me your letter and I shall attempt to answer some of the questions about Kansas football next fall.

To begin with, we are planning to have football at the present time, and the Chancellor wants football. Of course, we may have to wait and see just what the situation will be on our campus later in the summer as regards players and so forth. At present we have four lettermen on the campus: Kenneth Adams, quarterback, Carl Hird, guard, Don Johnson, tackle, and Junius Penny, center.

In addition, we have these men from last year's freshman numeral winners: Robert Tomlinson, guard, Kenny White, halfback, Dale Bush, halfback, Charles Keller, guard and tackle, Fred Humphrey, halfback, Bill Jameson, tackle, Warren Riegle, end, Thomas Warren, halfback, Joe Gray, end, Frank Pattee, halfback, Howard Bowman, halfback, and C. D. Williams, guard and tackle. Some or all of these boys may be gone by next fall.

I have observed that regardless of the caliber of the teams competing there is a great deal of interest if the teams are evenly matched. But if one team should be head and shoulders above the others, then the interest lags.

I have enjoyed reading your column for a number of years. You were very kind to me in your column on several occasions when I was coaching at the Junction City High School.

I trust that this information will be of some help to you, and if you would like any additional material I will be very glad to try to supply it.

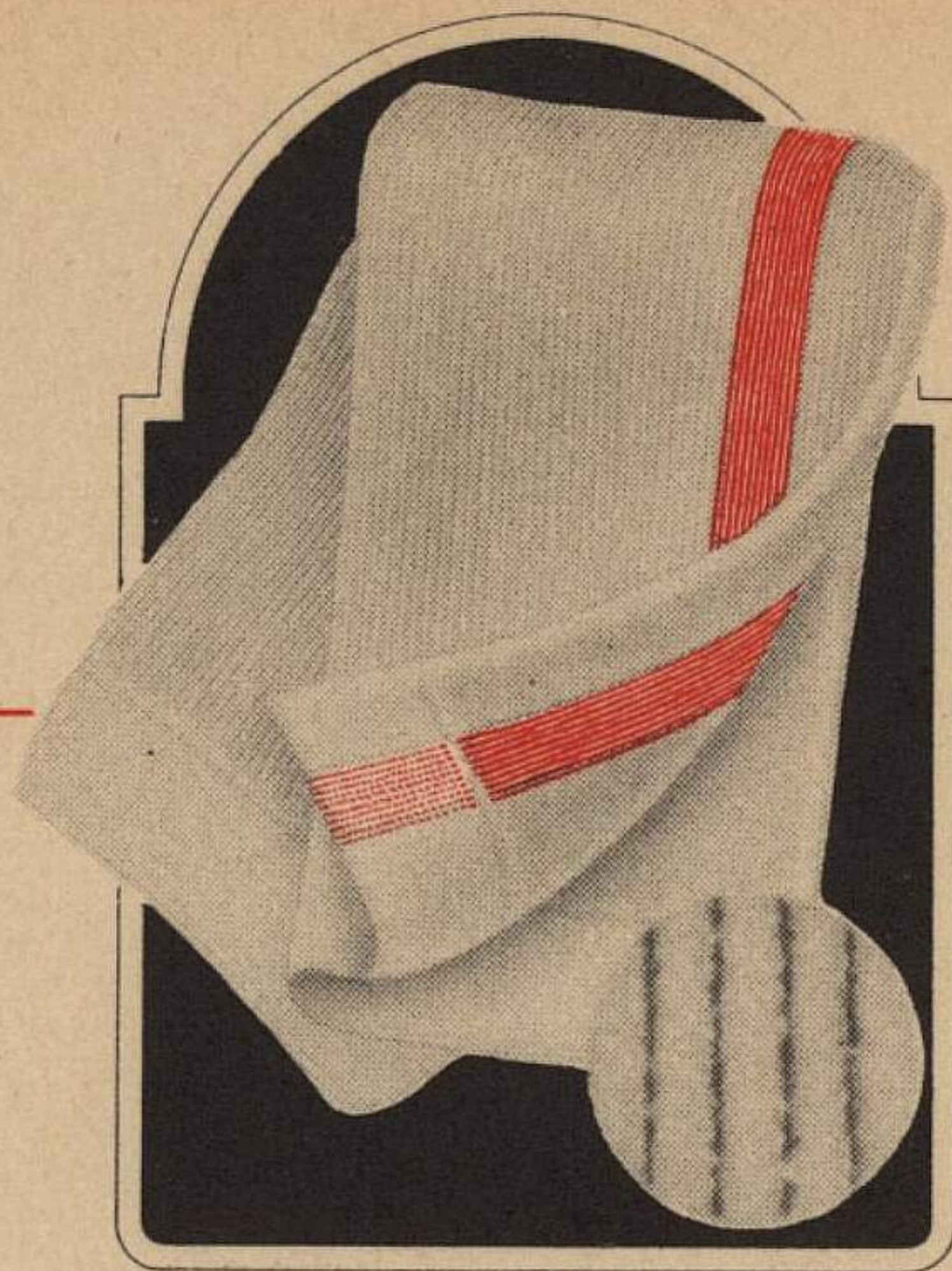

I want you to know that we are highly pleased with your towels, and know that you are doing the best you can, under the circumstances, to deliver the remainder.

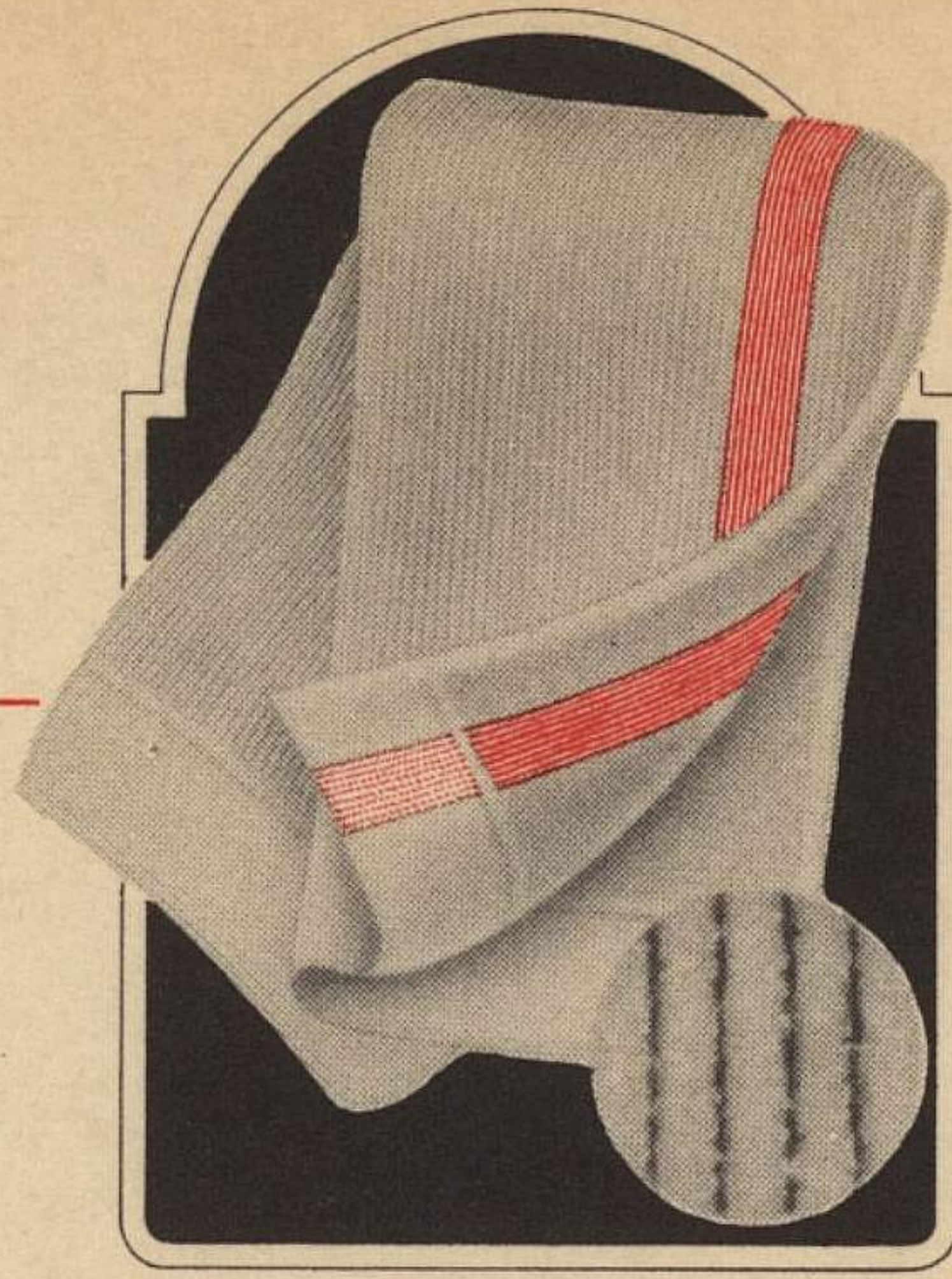


