



Dear Robin:

I was glad to have a visit with you last night, and in conformity with our conversation I am sending you the personnel of the Coaches Association. I would rather you not use this as yet publicly because many of the hotels have been calling on me for the business, but it is settled that the prices you submitted are very satisfactory and pleasing to us. We will do all we can to see that you get the full representation of the three organizations.

I do not want to write a letter to these people yet because it is ~~early~~. I want to precede your letter with a letter about the Hotel Continental. I would like for you to send me some folders and information so that I can write to each one of these coaches and the Rules body members, and later to the fortunate teams telling them about your hotel and the headquarters for basketball.

For the Rules Committee members we would need a room large enough for 20 to 24 men to sit at a table. This will be a closed meeting. There will be no outsiders invited. They will meet for three days in rules discussion. They will not need any other meeting place, with the exception of their own private rooms. It has always been the habit of the Rules Committee to vote a \$10.00 honorarium for the hotel employees' Christmas fund.

For the National Basketball Coaches Association we will need a room where 200 men can meet in conference.

Mr. John Glenn, who was manager of the Northwestern basketball team, will be my assistant, and I would like to have a room with him where we can have conferences and the like. A small suite would be perhaps all we would need.

The National Basketball Coaches Association always has a banquet on the second night. This would be March 29. As to the menu and entertainment, that is planned by a committee, and it is early for that. The officers of the Coaches Association will need a room in which ten or twelve men can meet for pre-convention discussions and to make their slate. The Hotel Whitcomb in San Francisco, where we had our semi-finals of the National Collegiate play-off, complimented the room for John Bunn, Harold Olsen and me as members of the committee in charge. Harold Olsen, from Ohio

State, will doubtless be here as he is chairman of the Olympic Committee, and John Bunn and I are members. But since I have made the drive to bring all the teams here to this district, because Kansas City is such a fine basketball town, they made me chairman of this group. I trust you will not think it is bragging, but I engineered the deal to bring the teams to Kansas City, and after doing that they appointed me to handle the details of it.

If I have missed anything I will write you, and if you think of anything more please ask it of me.



Dear "Hec":

Thanks for your very kind letter and additional information on the boys in the Pacific Coast Conference. Gee, these boys at Oregon really grow big! I saw this boy Dick play and I knew he was going to be a comer.

Hec, what do you think of these six foot seven boys? These basketball players are really getting taller all the time, and you know they said that if they eliminated the center jump they would get rid of the tall boys. I would like to get a few good converts to the 12-foot basket. I'll guarantee you if you will throw a 12-foot basket on these teams you will run these six foot seven boys out of the business unless they are so doggone good -- and those good ones are few and far between at that height. And then those six foot seven boys will have to shoot at the basket like all the rest of the boys and not dunk them in. Why don't you try a 12-foot basket just for research purposes? You will be amazed what it does to that mezzanine peeping goon.

That three-second lane rule, the interfering with the ball on or above the basket rule, the extra fouls for driving in -- all these things we immediately eliminate with the 12-foot basket. I would like to see a good strong man like you study the situation and come out for a higher basket. If you will try it out there will be no question about your findings.

I will certainly be happy to see you in Kansas City, but long before that time you will receive many letters from me because we have got a lot of work to do in connection with that Kansas City meeting. It is going to be a great tournament. In a few years this national championship will be one of the great events of the nation. It is the world series of basketball, you know.

Received your letter of the 10th. There is not much information that I can give you at this time. The correspondence that I had with John Bunn was chiefly concerning my duties as a Rules Committee member in gathering material from the entire Pacific Coast for next year's rule book as well as distributing the questionnaire. Briefly, he suggested that I take over all of the duties that he had in connection with basketball and the National Association. At the suggestion of Doc Bohler of W.S.C., who was a member of a committee of three to select a team from the Pacific Coast, Mr. Bunn has agreed to remain on the committee (is taking Bohler's place). This gives the Conference a representative on the committee in the southern end of the Conference otherwise we would not have had one.

You asked about the probable representative from the Coast and specifically about U.S.C. I think it is quite probably that U. S. C. will be the Western Coast representative. Thus far they have won all their games in the South. Oregon State is leading the Northern Division at present. Though Oregon, a team considerably revamped from the team which played in Madison Square Gardens during the Holidays, is in second place, they're really "going to town." They ran up a seventy-one and sixty points on Washington State in their two-game series Monday and Tuesday nights of this week. They may succeed in passing the Oregon Aggies and if they do, they're going to be tough as they have in the front court three men two of whom are six feet, seven inches in height and one six feet four inches. One of the six feet, seven inch men can jump like a kangaroo and shoots well. My team for the first time since I have been at Washington has relieved me of championship anxiety before the last week of the season.
