Dear Gaylord:

I am very happy to have your letter of April 13th and I second your feeling of indignation regarding the possible discrimination of the eastern and western teams. But this is not the case in this regard.

Here's what happened, Gaylord. When H. G. Olsen, the chairman of the Tournament Committee, and the manager of the eastern tournament, endeavored to get Duquesne in, Duquesne refused to go to Indianapolis unless they were granted expenses for fifteen men.

Previously our committee had agreed on a limit of twelve men, and I of course, wrote all of our people to that effect.

Olsen did not communicate with me the difficulty that he had with Duquesne until he got to Kansas City. He then told me the trouble and he said that he felt all the teams should have expenses for fifteen men regardless of whether fifteen made the trip or not. I heartily concurred in his views, and we expect to pay everyone of the teams full expenses for fifteen men. You will get your extra allowance, as will all the other teams, when and as soon as we can get these accounts in shape.

That I thought these teams who made this tournament possible should get a cut of the earnings after all expenses were paid and after the N.C.A.A. took a sizeable sum to assure them of their competence - say \$7500. Bus doubtless will consult you on the matter, but I have been fighting a pretty aggressive battle with some of the higher committeemen who feel that the N.C.A.A. general committee is entitled to all the money. I also learned that it is not even possible for any of this fund that the basketball committee earned to be ear-marked for

basketball. It all goes into the general fund.

You may count 100% on my obtaining for Rice and these other fine teams every penny that is coming to them. You will hear from me again shortly.

Dear Doctor Allen:

We hand you herewith the hotel bill as submitted to this office by Coach Brannon and would appreciate your returning same for our files. If for any reason you desire to delate any item, please do not hesitate to do so. In forwarding your check please make it for whatever amount you think right.

We were amazed to find at this date that we were permitted allowances for fifteen men instead of the twelve mentioned in all your communications. Frankness compells us to say that the oversight in properly acquainting the competing teams with the factors under which the competitions were held is most regrettable. In the light of these circumstances we feel that allowances for fifteen men should be made to all teams regardless to whether this number were carried to the competitions or not. It seems on the face of it a gross negligence in properly organizing the competitions.

I want you to know that there is nothing personal intended in this communication as we have only the highest regard for all the men connected with the tournament but we feel that there should be no occasion for us at this date finding that allowances are permitted one section not in keeping with the allowances permitted the other sections. I again do not hesitate to reiterate that if allowances are made for fifteen men in the Eastern division, they should likewise be made for the Western division regardless as to whether fifteen men competed or not. I certainly think that the men conducting the contests should have been thoroughly aware of the conditions under which the competitions were held in both divisions and all competing teams should have been apprised and competed under like circumstances. I would appreciate having from your committee some expressions regarding these matters.
