Thanks very much for your letter of the 26th and for sending me fifty reserved seat tickets for the basketball game to be played in Kansas City Saturday night. These arrived last evening, and have been turned over to our Ticket Manager. If there are any of them left, they will be brought to Kansas City by Ralph Graham, our assistant coach. He will be there Saturday morning to turn them in, if there are any to turn in, so that they can be sold that day.

It is a dirty shame that neither Kansas or Indiana can have any tickets along the side of the playing court. Those people running the tournament knew that some two teams would be playing there next Saturday. The least courteous thing they could have done would have been, before tickets were put on sale, to hold at least one hundred good tickets for each of the two competing institutions. Our people cannot understand why two teams playing for a national championship could not have some tickets along the side of the court. Personally, I have not heard of such a situation existing in connection with any big athletic contest. Even the Rose Bowl provides for each team to have a certain block of tickets on each side of the field. It would seem to me that the people in Lawrence have the same feeling about this that we have here at Indiana.

My dear Phog:-

Ole Olson was through here yesterday and we had a nice visit.

He asked me to send our team expenses to you and you would send us a check for reimbursement. In this connection I told him that the railroad tickets had been charged and that the hotel bill at the Muehlebach had also been charged. He said that he thought it best that when the railroad and hotel bills have been received, I forward them to you and you will then make payment direct to the Muehlebach and the railroad company. This being the case, I am enclosing bill for the expenses we paid out in connection with the handling of our team. The total amount of this bill is \$133.45. Receipts for all of these items are on file with the university comptroller here. We have a state regulation by the State Board of Accounts that requires this procedure in handling our expense items. I have made our bill out in an itemized form and have signed it.

Mr. Olson asked me to make settlement direct to you for the tickets that had been sent over here. We received 50, and 40 of these were returned by Ralph Graham to E. C. Quigley in Kansas City Saturday morning, March 30, 1940. That leaves ten to be accounted for; therefore, you will find enclosed my athletic revolving fund check for \$11.20 covering the price of these.

Just as soon as I receive the bill from the railroad company in Indianapolis and the bill from the Hotel Muehlebach, I will have them approved by Coach McCracken and forward them on to you for payment.

Ole gave me a fine report of the game and the splendid manner in which you had organized and promoted it. He was most enthusiastic about the entire set-up, and I told him that I thought you and he had done absolutely the right thing in stating that you would hold the tournament finals at Kansas City again next year. I note that the coaches will meet in New York, but even though they do, I still feel that these games should be played in Kansas City where promoters will be out of the picture and the games will be entirely under the supervision of college men and the receipts will also be under direct disposition of the college men.



This will acknowledge receipt of your expense account for the N.C.A.A. qualifying tournament in Kansas City on March 22 and 23, totaling \$884.00.

For your information, the committee decided to figure the expenses of fifteen men instead of twelve, as originally planned. Duquesne University held out for expenses for fifteen men before they would enter the eastern play-offs, and the committee agreed to their request and approved expenses for this number of men in the Kansas City play-offs.

In checking over your expense account I find that you have figured your railway fare and pullman from Boulder to Kansas City, which is as it should be. You have also listed hotel for Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, and meals from Monday up to and including Sunday morning. I am a little hesitant about approving this for payment due to the fact that you have included hotel and meals for Monday and Tuesday.

We, of course, are aware of the fact that your team was on the way home from New York and would have had the expense of meals and pullman on to Boulder even though you had not participated in the tournament. None of the teams arrived in Kansas City prior to Thursday, as there was no reason for their being there previous to that time. Of course, I realize that it would have

been useless for your team to return to Boulder and back to Kansas City for the tournament. I only bring this question up as it appears to me there is a possibility of the committee criticizing my action in approving this expense where it appears there might be an overlapping of expenses from one trip to the other. As I figure it, it would amount to around \$108.00, deducting hotel and meals for Monday and Tuesday. Where the pullman is allowed from Colorado it does not seem quite right that hotel should also be allowed for the two days involved.

I do not want you to think that I am criticizing too severely or questioning your expense account, but I think it is much better to get these things straightened out before payment is made rather than wait until it might be pushed back at me. I shall be happy to have you advise me more fully what your thoughts are in this connection before sending your check covering the account.




