

Notes:

part 1 - (1) We find this: Either the 4 ft zone should be mandatory or maybe a 3ft zone - We have appeared on 10 different courts this year and only one had the 4 ft area. Others admit they could do so but did not feel justified until they saw results. Others say no - makes our floor too long or if both HSchool and college use floor - extra lines are confusing.

We find it eliminates many out of bounds and tie ups under basket.

part 1 - (4) 2. Fouling from the rear still is abused in our league. In many games, we find only one official. In such cases many deliberate pushes in the back are not caught.

part 1 - (2) 3. I think defense should get the ball after a technical foul. The various offenses that draw that foul are not severe in nature and opportunity for free throw is enough.

part 2 - (3) 4. I favor return to use of center jump with rotation, providing two officials are employed. With only one man, it is impossible to get all the jostling around the center jump circle.
