

Meeting of the Basketball Coaches of the Big Six
Conference at the K.C.A.C. in Kansas City Dec. 5, 1932.

Members represented: Iowa State, Kansas, Nebraska, Missouri.

The 1933 basketball rules as passed by the Joint Rules Committee were adopted in their entirety together with interpretations which have been sent out by the editor of the rules. Discussions during the meeting were intended only for clarification and interpretation.

RULE 4. Any official ball may be used. Big Six members will use the following balls in home games:

Iowa State - Rawlings	
Kansas -- Allen	
Kansas State - Rawlings	(All are of the
Missouri - Wilson	double-laced type)
Nebraska - Wilson	
Oklahoma - Spalding	

Air pressure is to be 13 pounds.

RULE 6. Conference games are to be officiated by one man unless otherwise provided by directors.

The official's uniform shall be the customary vertically black and white alternate stripes on the shirt, and navy blue trousers.

RULE 8, Sec. 8. (Note sheet ⁴⁻⁵ which contains approved ruling as of Dec 1 made by the editor of the rules)

Team A has ball in front court with one pass to back court permitted. In case the official makes an error and calls the "pass-back" a violation the rules make no provision as to correction of the error. INTERPRETATION in Big Six games shall be as follows: Captain of team A must protest immediately before ball is put in play. If official sustains the protest it is Team A's ball at the opposite sideline. Should protest be made after B has put ball in play it shall not be allowed, and play shall continue as if no error was made.

RULE 14, Sec 12 (Note attached sheets for approved rulings)

Offensive player catches the ball with back to the basket and one foot in the freethrow lane. Before three seconds passes he lifts the foot which is in the lane, or steps out of the lane. Should he thereafter return that foot to the lane the count shall be made from the instant he first caught the ball.
