

6. The second period could be a panel discussion, with the visiting team and three or four representatives from the local area participating. The topic of this meeting would be determined by the wishes of the local<sup>V</sup> and the personnel of the visiting team.

7. The University would make a special effort to get all graduates of K.U. at the conference. The first purpose would be to permit them to have conferences with the K.U. staff on any of the problems which they were having. Especially important is this for first or second year teachers who may be present. Another purpose would be to talk with superintendents and principals who have K.U. students on their staff to find if there is any way in which the University can be of assistance in strengthening the teachers who have graduated from K.U. This service to these teachers and administrators has been found to be very effective follow-up service.
8. The whole purpose of this conference program is to develop a kindlier attitude of school people toward the University, and to have some further evidence that the University is interested in the problems of teachers in the field. We are not contemplating that we shall take a prepared program to the conferences, in the sense that we have something which the teachers in the field should have. Rather we intend to go out to discuss their problems with them, and to offer any leadership which we possess.
9. It is planned that the University will bear the cost of the travel of the visiting group. The local area will be charged with most of the promotion of the conference, but the University will have to expend some effort in publicity.
10. It is thought that it might be possible to hold about six such centers during the course of a school year. The probable cost of travel, etc. for each would be about \$50. Such a program would entail a budget of approximately \$300.
