COUPERATIVE HOUSES. The Harmon Co-op and Ricker hall, cooperative houses offer good accommodations at low cost. Students do their own work and share living expenses. Further information may be secured from the Adviser of Women, room 121 Frank Strong Hall.

SORORITIES. Ten social sororities maintain houses for women students. Membership is open on invitation only. Information may be secured from the Pan-Hellenic Secretary, room 228 Frank Strong Hall.

ROOMS AND APARTMENTS. A list of approved rooms and apartments in private homes is available at the office of the Adviser of Women, room 121 Frank Strong Hall.

MEALS

Students who live in quarters where meals are not provided will find that their needs can be met adequately by boarding clubs or commercial restaurants at hand in the student districts. The University Dining Hall in the Memorial Union Building serves good food at reasonable prices and in attractive surroundings. The price of meals will vary somewhat with individuals, but it will be wise for the student to figure on \$1 a day. The cost will be somewhat lower if he eats in a cooperative club or a scholarship residence hall.
