To the Executive Committee, K. U. Athletic Board.

- A. Your special committee on finances wishes to report as follows:
1. Owing to uncertainty involved, we do not favor resetting the bonded debt in accordance with the one plan submitted. Further study of refunding possibilities should be made.
 2. That a loan for \$8,000 be negotiated at once for the purpose of carrying the athletic program until March, 1937. The loan to be split between banks in Lawrence, Kansas City, and certain individuals.
 3. That the playground property south of the Hill and that the houses and lots adjacent to the stadium be offered for sale to the state at the prices paid for such property by the Board.
 4. That the Board study the possibility of interesting the Legislature in purchasing the stadium for the amount of the outstanding bonded debt.
 5. In the event the Legislature fails to make appropriations for the stadium or fails to authorize the purchase of the intramural field and the houses and lots, that the properties last named be placed on the open market for immediate sale; *provided, further, there is no refunding.*
- B. Your committee desires to make the following additional recommendations:
1. That consideration by the Executive Committee be given the student activity ticket for the purpose of deciding which one of the following policies the Board should pursue:
 - (a). That the share assigned to athletics be increased to \$6, partly through an increase in the total cost of the ticket and partly through a redistribution of percentages among the cooperating activities.

(b). That students be given the choice of buying yearly tickets to all athletic events for \$6 or a general activity ticket including athletics at a higher price.

(c). That the Board withdraw from all participation in the activity ticket.

2. That competitive bids for broadcasting rights be investigated by the Executive Committee.

3. That tickets to athletic events be made available to faculty members and employes of the University at prices only slightly higher than those charged students.

4. That the Budget Committee of the University be requested to study the possibility of paying a larger share of coaches' salaries from University funds.

C. We are not sure how far the jurisdiction of our committee extends. Assuming that it is one of our duties to consider matters which in a general way pertain to the enlargement of income we propose the following:

1. That an end coach be employed throughout the football season at a salary of \$1,200-\$1,400.

2. That a freshmen coach be employed at a salary of approximately \$2,500. (Mr. Hargiss to be assigned as coach of the "B" team).

3. That the ^{Board} Association organize an alumni group to inform other alumni concerning our athletic needs and program, to aid in interesting qualified young men to attend the University, and to support the athletic program in such other ways as may become advisable.

We suggest the state be divided into a number of districts, somewhere between 12 and 20, that one man be chosen as head representative in each district and that he select some five or six graduates

former students, or friends of the University, to work with him. The close cooperation of the Alumni Association in this respect is deemed necessary. However, it is our belief that the representatives should be tied in directly with the Athletic Board. Some one member of the alumni body should be chosen to head and direct the entire program.

4. If the money can be found, we believe it would be advisable to have a competent alumnus cover the state during the coming winter and spring, primarily for the purpose of informing alumni concerning the exact status of the athletic situation at the University and of developing a favorable alumni attitude wherever criticism is found.

5. Your committee believes that our major problem is one of securing general cooperation. We need a united front so far as alumni, students, faculty, legislators, and general public are concerned. The committee believes that the various elements can be brought in harmony through energetic and judicious action initiated by the Athletic Board.
