Dear Ad:

Mrs. Wellhausen called me yesterday afternoon about the room which one of the boys didn't take. Along in the summer I told her about this boy, and I was only trying to help her out. I did not know that anyone was taking all of her rooms. I do not feel any more obligation to her than I would to anyone else. If she had told me that all of her rooms were being held by someone else I would not have sent this boy down there.

By way of explanation I might say that Forrest Hewitt, principal of the Washington, Kansas, high school, appealed to me to fix this boy up with a room where he would have a nice quiet place to study. Feeling that Mrs. Wellhausen needed the financial help, I sent the boy down.

He was not supposed to pledge a fraternity because he did not have enough money, and then he called me and told me that he had pledged Kappelman's fraternity. Then he called Mrs. Wellhausen and told her that he could not take the room. Mrs. Wellhausen could have appealed to Mr. Werner if she so desired. Apparently she did not desire to do this, and the boy went over to live at the fraternity.

My only interest in the matter was to help her out financially, and I don't see that there is any adjustment to be made.
