

CONCLUSION

It is to be hoped that the foregoing report presents this state of the Memorial Union in the light as envisioned by those who initiated its beginnings and who deserve testimonial to their efforts. In its use and in its high regard in student minds it compares very well indeed to other comparable Unions. The point of saturation in its use has, however, been reached.
