Dear Roy:

Thanks for your fine letter of explanation. I just have a letter from Mr. E. B. "Burt" DeGroot, Jr., in charge of physical training for the Fourth Air Force, at Riverside, California, in which he says: "The air base at Fresno has one of your Goal-Hi standards, but the new athletic officer there has been unable to find the set of rules which should originally have come with it. If you have an extra copy of the rules I would appreciate receiving one. As our facilities and equipment grow I intend to recommend a Goal-Hi standard for all bases."

Roy, won't you send two of the Goal-Hi rule books to Mr. DeGroot at 4057 Elmwood Court, Riverside, California, and he will see that the athletic officer of the air base at Fresno gets them.

I would like to have you cultivate DeGroot, as he is a prince of a gentleman and a real educator. He was in our department of physical education here for two years and made a great impression both as to work and as to intelligence. His father laid out the first playground in Chicago - South Park Playground. He is now on the West coast in charge of the Boy Scouts of America in the West.

Burt DeGroot's brother is Dudley DeGroot, Ph.D., who was athletic director at San Jose Teachers College, and he as their football coach ran up the highest scores made in the United States last year. At present he is athletic director at Rochester University, Rochester, New York. You will remember Dr. DeGroot, I believe, because he refereed the N.C.A.A. Western Play-off between Kansas and the University of Southern California. I would like to see you cultivate Dudley DeGroot at Rochester. Write him a letter and ask him about Goal-Hi. This is a fine family of pioneer physical directors.
