I desire to acknowledge receipt of check from your secretary, Mr. Banashek, for \$750.00 covering royalties of Goal-Hi in accordance with your letter of June 11. In your letter you state that you think you had approximately one thousand Goal-Hi's to dispose of in such a deal that on a lump royalty we would agree to cut from \$1,000 to \$750.

I was very happy to agree to this plan and my reply was, "Under war effort situation accept your suggestion". This had to do with the one thousand that were sold. Do we not have a royalty on Goal-Hi's sold during the two months previous to June and up to June 11?

Also, you state that you are retaining only a few hundred Goal-Hi's for shipment during the next few months to important customers. Would we not have a future royalty on these sales?
