September 3, 1940 Hr. John Priteeh Pflugorville, Tomo Dear Mr. Pritsohe I have your letter to Dr. Allen including your transcripts from the Texas Luthoran College and the University of Texas. I find that you have not the requirements in Imman Anatomy and Physiology; however, accepting your student teaching for three hours I note that you have had but nine hours of education. One of our requirements for entrance to graduate work is fifteen hours of education; therefore, you would be deficient in six hours of undergraduate work in this field, two hours of which I would suggest be Introduction to School Administration which would cause you to take the 30 hours work on a graduate level plus six hours of education on the undergraduate level. This would require perhaps a year and a sumer, as I find it very difficult for a man to complete his Master's work (which includes the writing of a thesis) in a single year. I might explain that our arrangement for a Master's Degree calls for at least fifteen hours of education on a graduate level, and the remainder in physical education on a graduate level. The thesis is considered education and counts for from two to eight hours, depending upon the topic solected. I am filling your letter along with your transcripts for future reference. Should you decide to come to the University of Manaas I shall be pleased to do everything I can to help you in your enrollment and the arrangement of your work. Sincercly yours. Edwin R.
