Your recent letter of inquiry relative to Arthur B. Adams of the College of Business Administration of the University of Oklahoma, has been received and duly neglected.

The trouble with you is that you have a tendency to remember only those coaches whose teams managed by some miracle to defeat teams coached by you. As a matter of fact, Dr. Adams served in my place on the faculty of Central College while I was on leave of absence during the year, 1912-13.
