

Technical foul  
(Delaying game)

(2. B's ball behind A's basket.) (3. Legal play.) (4. May be foul on B1.) In (b): Does goal

count? No Whose ball? B's ball Where? At out of bound spot near  
where violation (Double dribble) was committed.

5. A free throw attempt by A1, strikes high on the backboard and rebounds toward basket. When it is directly above the basket, B1 bats it and it strikes the backboard again and then goes into the

basket. May B ever legally bat a free throw? Yes Has A1 committed a violation? Yes (B really caused a violation)

Has a double violation been committed? Yes When does free throw end? When touched by B

Player. When does ball become dead? When touched by B player

Does A's free throw goal count? No How many points are scored? One point is awarded  
for B's interfering with ball in plane

6. A1 pushes B1 while he is in the act of throwing for goal. B1 chooses to attempt the first free of basket. throw but to waive the second. After the ball has been placed at the disposal of B1, A2 commits

a foul. May the second free throw be waived? No - since another foul - has altered the original situation.

the last throw? Captain of Team B has choice of either having his team attempt the free throw for A's foul or declining and throwing in at midcourt.

7. After ball is placed at the disposal of a free thrower, A1:

(a) A6 reports to the Scorer. Should horn blow? No

(b) B1 asks for a time-out. Should it be granted? No

(c) A2 asks for time-out. Should it be granted? Yes

(d) Scorers discover that A3 is illegally in the game. Should the horn blow? Yes

8. A1 has ball out of bounds at side. He throws it entirely across the court where it is caught by B1 who is standing on the opposite side line. (1. A's ball at point where B1 caught it.) (2. B's ball at place where A1 throw ball in.) (3. Ball was not inbounds at any time)

9. In the closing minutes of play, Captain of A has been waiving free throws and B1 deliberately

pushes A1 in order to have the watch stopped. Ruling: Two free throws should be awarded - and the deliberate fouls will cease to be a problem in closing minutes of a game.

10. A1 is awarded a free throw and Captain states he will waive it. As the ball is taken to mid-court, A2 takes legal time-out and the Coach sends in A6 to replace the Captain. May the new

Captain now choose to have free throw attempted? No

11. A1 attempts single free throw for personal foul. It is unsuccessful but B1 is in the lane too soon. The Official orders another free throw but before the ball is placed at disposal of the free

thrower, Captain asks to waive it. Should request be granted? No as this is merely a substitute throw and not a another foul or altered situation.

12. B1 pushes A1 and one free throw is awarded. Before the ball is placed at the disposal of the free thrower, the B Coach is fouled for signalling for a sleeper play to follow the free throw. (1. Ball is in play if last throw is unsuccessful.) (2. Any player of A may attempt the throw for technical foul.) (3. After last throw, it is A's ball at mid-court.)

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This is new this year - as last year the technical foul would have been attempted first - and then the attempt for B's foul - and ball would be in play if missed.
