Dear Glenn:

I am sorry that I did not see you when you were in the office yesterday morning. However, I have some very sad news for you in that it is not necessary for me to see Coach Hargiss because I checked up on our budget and I find that we have to make very drastic cuts in our personnel in both the towel room and in our irregular payroll.

Unless we get a large increase in our student towel ticket service we are going to be forced to curtail our personnel about thirty or forty per cent. We received this year a \$1900.00 cut in our budgetary allowance for physical education over last year's budget. We have gone ahead with imperative improvements, treating the whole situation in an expectant manner, hoping somehow that increases would come in the above mentioned way.

We cannot tell about this until after the enrollment for the second semester, but I doubt that we will have a sustained income comparable to the first semester. People generally go in their shells like crustaceans during the winter months, and I do not expect the unusual to happen.
