Teams will be thus classified and only those universities observing common traditions and practices will be scheduled.

President Prichard of the Carnegie Foundation suggests that no admission be charged to any of our intercollegiate contests and that the high priced professional coach be dispensed with.

This answer lies with the American Association of University Presidents. When this august and powerful body of intellectuals decree such an edict doubtless it will be done.

But the college president being a learned man in the body politics is not ready for such a heroic if not suicidal move at the present time. While athletics have their decided drawbacks they do provide subsidies for many non paying student activities that could not exist otherwise. The physical education program is supported in large part or almost wholly from the earnings of intercollegiate athletics.
