

2. Stepping from pitcher's box or <sup>pitcher</sup> throwing to an unoccupied base with a man on first  
(ie) throw to third base with a man on first.
3. Make any move regularly made in delivering to the plate and not throwing ball to plate.
4. After taking stretch must stop momentarily before delivering ball unless regularly take stretch and throw all in one movement. Then soon as begin stretch must deliver to home plate.
5. ~~Make~~ Start to throw one place home or occupied base must complete your throw.

(B) If no one on base there would be no balks

Delmon Green

A pitched ball becomes a dead ball.

1. When it strikes the batsman
2. When it strikes the umpire
3. When ball is hit by batter and strikes an umpire before a fielder has a chance to field the ball.
4. A balk is made by the pitcher
5. A ball hit foul into the stands

B. Ball back in play when umpire calls play and ball returned to pitcher's box.
