Scouting report, Regional tournament

Saw one boy in this tournament who I definitely think is college prospect in basketball. Also supposed to be a top hand at football. Name is Ervin Bussart, a boy I am sure we already have contacted. Height 6-2, Weight 180. Bussart looked exceptionally good around the basket with either hand or with under hand two handed efforts. Best play director I've ever seen in small high school (Wamego) Continually opened up teammates by driving for goal then passing off. Exceptionally good passer. Made only two bad tosses all evening. Play reminds me of Gerald Tucker, rather slow, but good in all departments except defense. Showed some understanding of post guard, however, by guarding opponent in front. Most of the time, however, let kid get ball and shot. Coaching is all he needs here. Also not quite as good a rebounder as he should be. Main thing is his savvy of game, good scoring and passing ability. More than once he yelled "cut" or "break" to a teammate. Showed high degree of understanding of game. Accused of being slow by some persons, but can run a quarter in :55.0. His folks are Mexican-Indian. He is interested in going to college and will need help. Was 18 in January. Was poised and confident in conversation.

Three other boys are worth another look. Peters, a junior at Wamego, is around 6-4 or 6-5. Rugged on backboard. Can score. Should be good in one more season. Howe and Lundberg of Randolph. Don't know classification. Lundberg looked exceptionally good as a post guard. Seems to understand game far better than average. Is a pretty good passer and ball handler. Howe is quite <sup>fast</sup> ~~pass~~ and an excellent shot. Worth another look. Martin Isaacson is coach and principal.
