KANSAS CITY EQUITATION TRIP OCTOBER 17 and 18

Information

1. Leave from Mott's stables at 7:30 Friday morning.
2. You may ride either Friday or Saturday or both days. We must know definitely which day or days you plan to ride.
3. You will be given six hours credit if you ride both days and three if you ride only one. You will be asked to pay on the regular basis but since these hours will be credited toward your first half semester's riding, your total expenses for the first half semester will remain the same - eight dollars. (You will probably get to ride much more than the time with which you will be credited.)
4. Meals
Box lunches will be prepared by the cafeteria for a charge of twenty five cents each for Friday noon. You will need to take money to pay for a weiner roast or steak fry Friday night and Saturday noon. Also, we will have to buy our breakfasts Friday morning and dinners Saturday evening.
5. Lodging
For those who plan to make the two day trip, lodging will be provided in cabins in Bonner Springs free of charge. However, you will need to bring two or three blankets for bedding. You should also take your toothbrush, towel, and any toilet articles that you may need.
6. Upon arrival at Kansas City Saturday afternoon, the horses will be shipped back to Lawrence and the responsibility of the University ends, except that there will be transportation furnished back to Lawrence after the evening performance at the American Royal. You may attend the Royal or not as you prefer. However, we urge you to attend the Royal in a group. General admission to the Royal is fifty cents plus tax and there is an additional charge for reserved seats.
7. Girls who do not plan to accompany the group home must make arrangements with the Dean of Women.
8. Students making the trip must turn in a list of classes that they will miss to Mr. Shenk not later than Tuesday.
9. In as much as the University is to a certain extent responsible for you during this trip, we will expect cheerful cooperation from each of you in the observance of any rules or regulations found necessary for the safety and welfare of the group.
