I am giving you herewith excerpts from the Minutes of the special meeting of the Big Six Directors held in Kansas City, Mo. March 1st, which pertain to basket ball -

The directors voted basket ball scouting be limited to one man on one game with the total scouting of Big Six teams not to exceed four games. Motion by Jones, second by Haskell.


The directors disapproved the request of the basket ball coaches for twenty games of basket ball. Motion by Faurot, second by Veenker.

The limit of players on the home squad used in conference basket ball games was removed. Motion by Henry, second by Haskell.

The basket ball schedules for 1942-43 shall be made out at the December 1941 meeting of the Big Six and no games shall be scheduled that night (December 6). Motion by Jones, second by Haskell.

The basket ball coaches shall submit a minimum of ten officials on a preferential basis to the commissioner of officials for appointment in basket ball games. Motion by Jones, second by Haskell.

Dear Louie:

I am returning the marked ballot pronto. You can see that I am for scouting and for twenty games.

I am also definitely in favor of removing the restriction on basketball players at home. It is a discrimination against basketball to hold them to only 10 competitors at home, and I am in favor of at least extending the traveling number to 11 players, but not necessarily meaning the 11 would make all trips. However, there are times when you need more than 10 on trips and I certainly would be in favor of extending that limitation to 11.

Basketball is no pauper's game. It makes more money than baseball, track or any of the other minor sports and there is no reason why this discrimination should be against basketball.

I think the proper way for the directors and the faculty representatives to handle the matter is to get a recommendation from the coaches. Then, if they do not want to act on that, they can take the responsibility which they have of doing it their way. I think it is poor administration the way it is done now.

This was especially true when the N.C.A.A., the faculty representatives and the athletic directors all said, "We want to increase the number of competitors so we can help Uncle Sam." They have gone on record as doing exactly the opposite as to the way they expressed their feelings to the President.




