Dear Doctor:

The State Board of Health, on November 22, 1939, passed a new regulation concerning the work of the laboratory, a copy of which is enclosed. You will note that the indigent statement formerly required on all blood specimens sent in for the serodiagnosis of syphilis has been abolished and from now on the physician must certify that it will be difficult or impossible for the patient to pay for having this examination made. This not only applies to specimens for the diagnosis of syphilis, but also to all other examinations, with the exception of tuberculosis. Also, the present ruling does away with free Wassermanns on pregnant women and from now on they must come under the same category as other patients.

Enclosed is a copy of the statute passed by the legislature in 1909 on the free diagnosis of tuberculosis. Attention is called to this statute which requires the laboratory to make examination of sputum from persons suspected of having tuberculosis, whether it is sent in by a physician or individual. Also a report must be given to either on request. As you will note this just covers tuberculosis.

I am sorry to inform you that under the new resolution all specimens mailed to the laboratory must be sent FIRST CLASS MAIL due to the certifying statement appearing on the "Data Blank". Previously, under the Postal Laws and Regulations, Sec. 589, Par. 4, the specimens could be sent Parcel Post rates, but would be pouch-ed with letter mail. Please note the changes in postage rates.

I would also like to call your attention to the following quotation from the "Laws, Rules and Regulations of the State Board of Health".

"Misuse of Outfits - Specimen outfits are distributed by the State Board of Health solely for use in sending specimens to the Public Health Laboratory. Their use in submitting specimens to private laboratories or for any other purpose than that specified constitutes a misuse of state property."

Our loss of outfits is very large and it would be appreciated if you will help us reduce the expense of purchasing so many new ones.

For your information as to the type of work done free by your laboratories, I would like to quote the following:




"Work Authorized - The work of the Public Health Laboratory shall be limited to those bacteriological, serological and parasitological examinations which are directly related to the detection and control of communicable diseases and to the manufacture of such chemical and biological products used in the prevention of communicable diseases as may be authorized by the secretary and executive officer of the Kansas State Board of Health."

If you desire the new Data Blanks for replacement in outfits you have on hand, kindly let us know and they will be furnished. They are in the hands of the printer and will be available in a few days.

For further information relative to the work of the laboratories please write us. These are your laboratories, please make use of them.

LEGISLATIVE ACT RELATIVE TO THE FREE DIAGNOSIS  
OF TUBERCULOSIS PASSED MARCH 2, 1909.

65-106. Microscopical examination of sputum forward-  
ed to bacteriologist of laboratory of State Board of Health; results  
of examination to be reported free of charge. 619. It shall be  
the duty of the bacteriologist of the laboratory of the State Board  
of Health, when so requested by any physician or by authorities of  
any hospital or dispensary to make, or cause to be made, a micro-  
scopical examination of the sputum forwarded to said bacteriologist  
as that of a person having symptoms of tuberculosis, which shall  
be forwarded to such officer, accompanied by a blank, giving name,  
age, sex, color, occupation, place where last employed, if known,  
and address of the person whose sputum it is. It shall be the  
duty of said bacteriologist promptly to make a report of the  
results of such examination, free of charge, to the physician or  
person upon whose application the same is made. (L. 1909, ch. 227,  
sec. 2; March 2.)



The following resolution was approved by the Kansas State Board of Health at a special meeting held in Topeka on November 22, 1939:

RESOLUTION

The Kansas State Board of Health hereby instructs the state laboratories to furnish laboratory service for diagnosis of all communicable diseases at public expense to all state and county boards of social welfare clients, social security act clients, Works Progress Administration clients, and to all other types of public assistance clients: to all inmates or patients of federal, state, county, or municipal institutions and homes; and to all other residents of the State of Kansas who find it difficult or impossible to pay the costs of laboratory service of this kind in the usual and customary manner.

In order to assist in the provision of this service, the Board has approved the following request form which will be placed in use effective January 2, 1940.

REQUEST FOR SPECIMEN EXAMINATION BY  
The Kansas State Board of Health Laboratory

I do hereby certify that it will be difficult or impossible for (name) of (street) (city) (county) to pay for this examination in the usual and customary manner. I request therefore, that this test be made for me without charge by the Kansas State Board of Health Laboratory.

Physician's signature \_\_\_\_\_

(Technical data in regard to test on reverse side of card)

The Board, also, instructs the State Laboratories to provide laboratory service at public expense and without requirements of request forms, to all county and city health officers, all employees of the Kansas State Board of Health, and all staff members of federal, state, county and municipal institutions and homes, who desire to utilize the services of the state laboratories in conjunction with their official duty.

The Board feels, however, that it should not provide services of this kind at taxpayers' expense to persons able to provide for themselves. Since for practical reasons the Board must leave the determination of this question to the physicians of the state, it respectfully requests the cooperation of all physicians in making certain that state laboratory services are furnished only to persons within the above approved categories.

All regulations in conflict herewith are revoked.

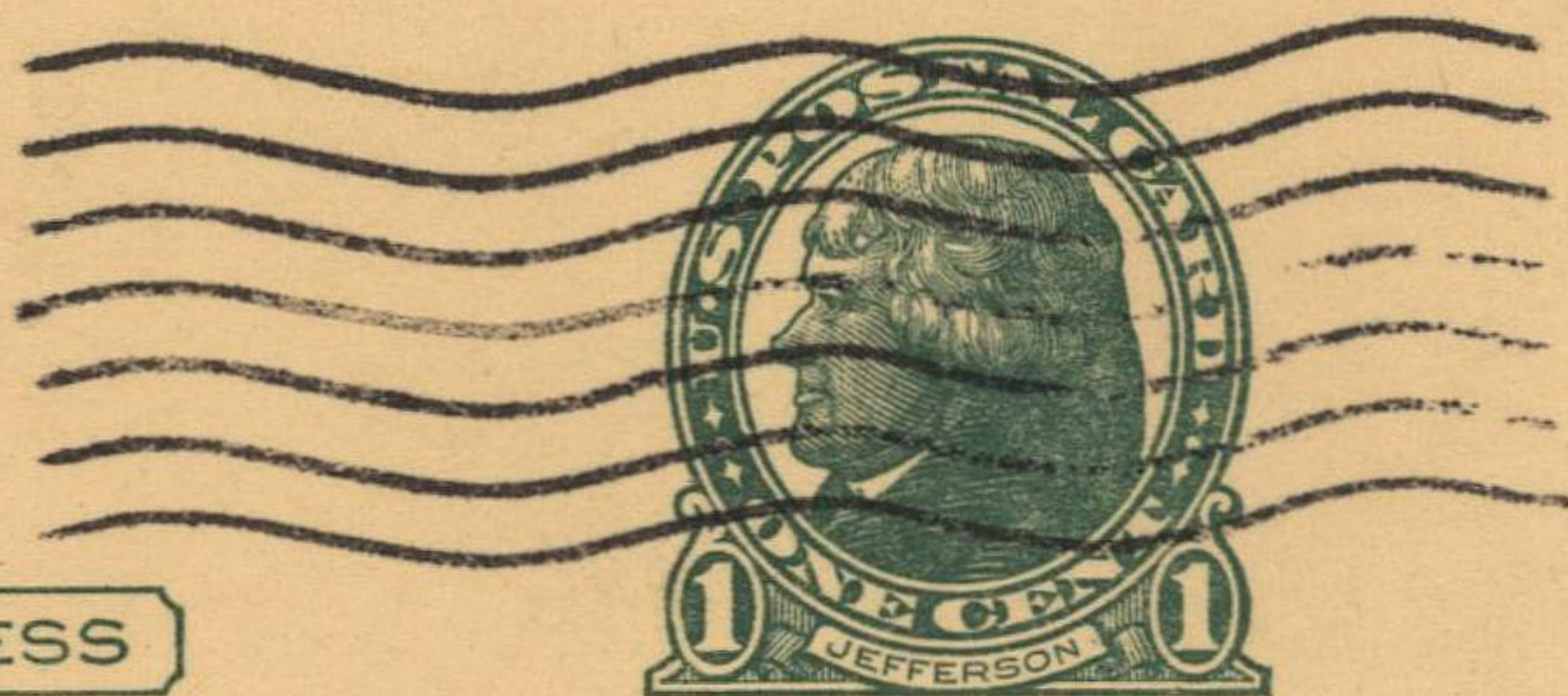
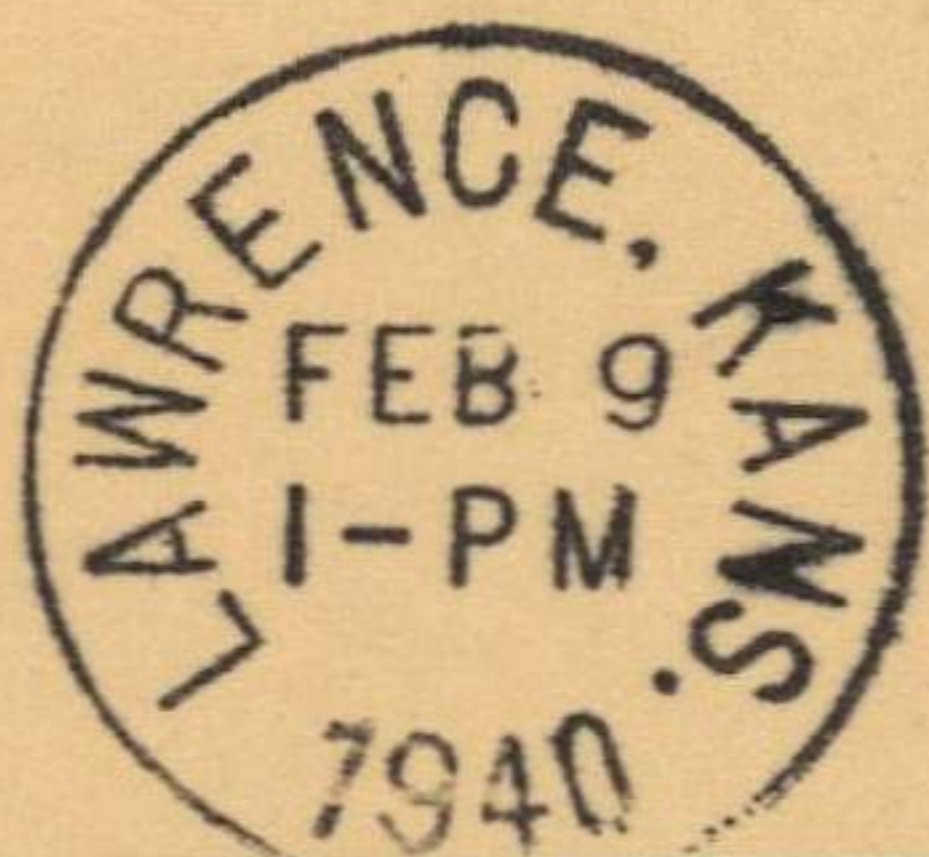

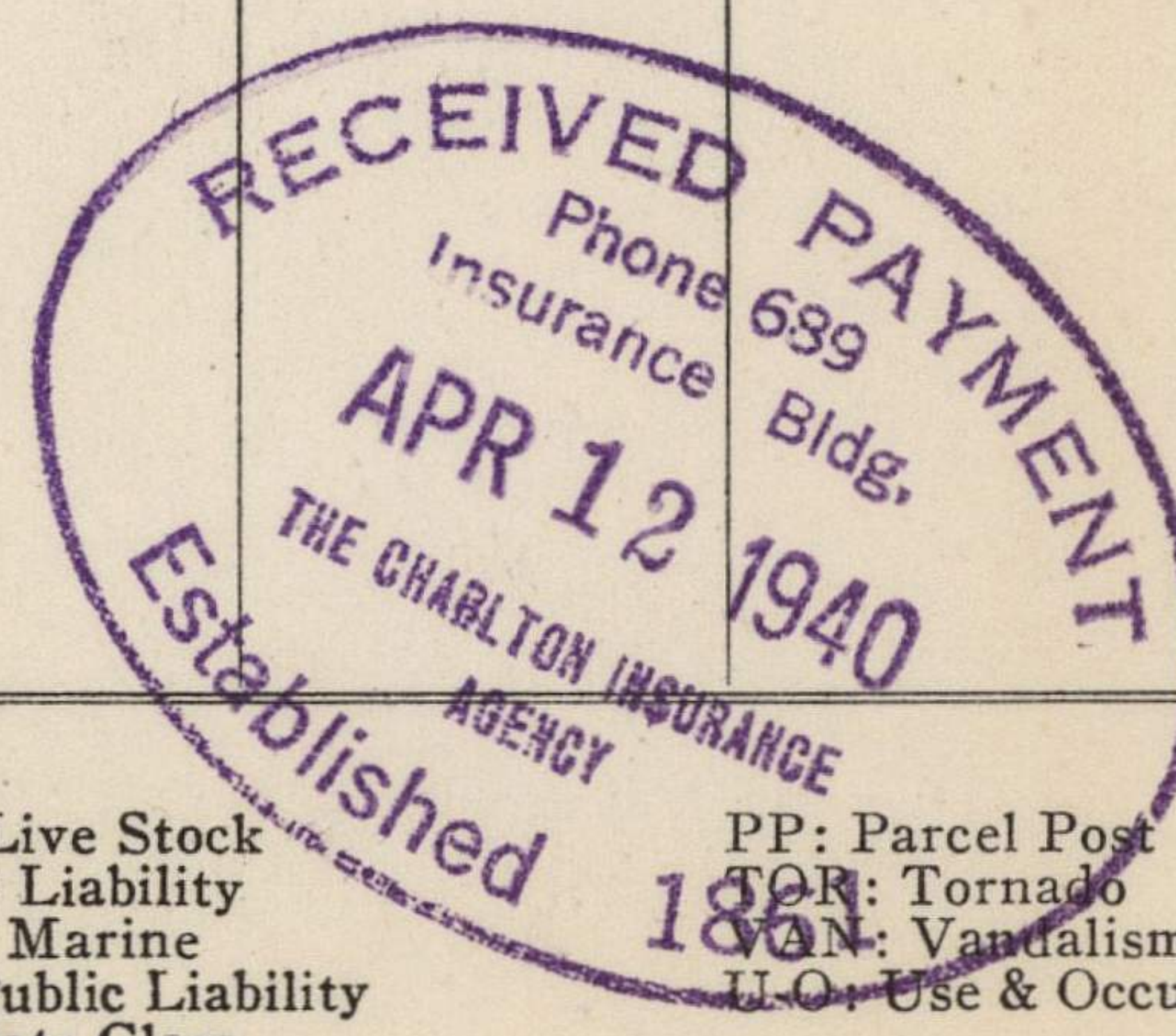

We're going to have a lot of fun with this new gadget and expect to keep you advised concerning our health and well being via the record route.

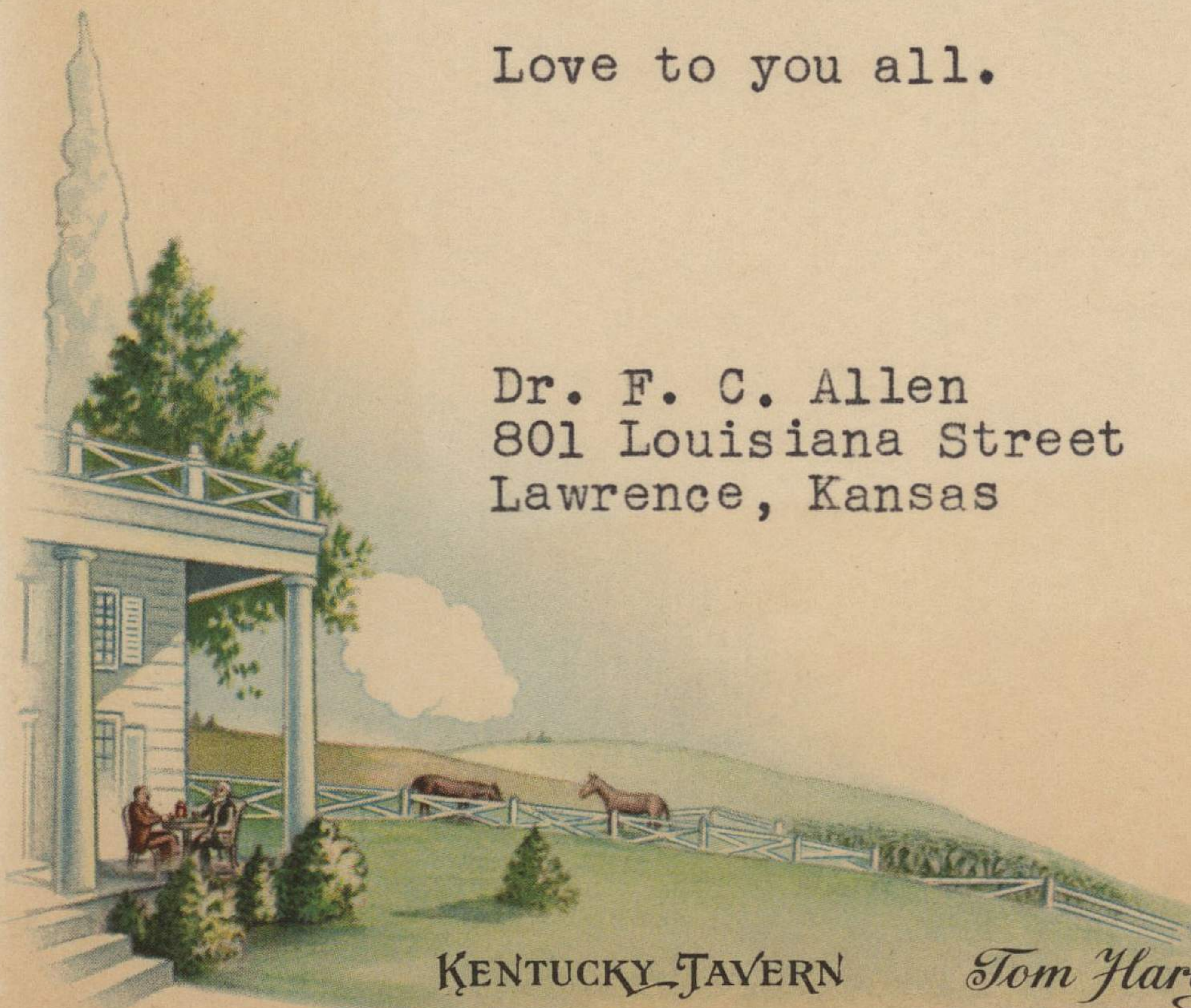
