and had a lot of fum. I remember those baseball-days as vividly as if they were but yesterday. So just know that I am pulling for that boy of yours in every possible way.

I never thought of sending you a copy of the letter that I dictated earlier this morning, but I think I will do it now. I wrote Bruce Drake a letter this morning so that a year from now we wouldn't have the same thing happen to us again down there. I guess Oklahoma will always be that way, because it's Oklahoma. They are fine fellows, but it is the worst hit-and-miss set-up that I have ever seen.

Just think, there wasn't a man in that building that could let us in that dressing room, and the janitor was home and didn't have a car. And if it had not been for a fellow that was keeping the outer door where the athletes come in for Bruce, who loaned his car, then the Lord knows when the fellow would have come to let us in. He got him, and when he opened our door, after the boys had lain on those benches in their own way trying to sleep or act as if they were - but actually they were as nervous as a bunch of cats on a tin roof - and when this janitor came with the key, I said, "Gentlemen, the president of the University of Oklahoma!" That was an outrage!
